Summer Topic

Summer and Journeys



Welcome back and hope you all had a great Easter holiday.

The theme for the summer term is Summer (seasons) and Journeys.

Children will learn about the Summer season and understand the natural world including seasonal changes relating to the weather, observing how seeds grow into plants and learning about some life cycles of animals.

Children will learn about the journeys we make on foot, type of transport on the road, where we can visit by rail, how we can travel on or under water and where they will like to go. They will be able to use their imagination to build types of transport, bus garage, train station or airport with lego or junk modelling. They will be able to talk about how they travel to School, read books like Summer is here by Heidi Pros Gray, How do you know it is Summer by Ruth Owen, Guess how much I love you in the summer by Sian Smith, Paddington Bear in London, We are going on a Bear hunt and Mr Grumpy's Motor Car by John Burnigham.

The Children will be learning words to describe size and identify words in stories like huge, big, enormous, small and tiny to mention a few.

Some of the Nursery rhymes and songs they will be learning are Once I Caught a Fish Alive, one potato two potato, 5 little peas, 5 little men in a flying saucer and there's a tiny caterpillar on a leaf.

The following are suggestions you can do with your child (ren) to consolidate their learning about Summer (seasons) and Journeys:

<u>Resources you will need:</u> a plant pot or container to grow plants like empty yoghurt or any plastic cups, seeds, paper and family photos taken when travelling.

- Read some of the books above with your children
- Visit a garden centre
- Talking about different types of transport on the way to Nursery or going out
- Visit train stations, learning about train tickets, passports for travel
- Talking about Sun and road safety
- Planting seeds in a pot and measure the height of the plant regularly
- Discussing what a plant needs to grow and how we grow
- Role play with your children Travel agent with holiday brochures, making number plates for cars, pretend you are driving any mode of transport etc

Leavers trip and Graduation

We have booked a leavers trip for all the children starting reception in September. We are going to Wingham Wildlife Park in Canterbury on Thursday 14th July. The cost for the coach and entry to the park is £30. To secure the booking for your child please make payment by the end of April. We are taking bookings on a first come first served basis.

Reception Admissions

30 hours Eligibility

All Parents who qualify for 30 hours (for child/ren who turned 3 before 31 August 2022) should have con-Firmed on the Childcare choices website www.childcarechoices.gov.uk by the 29th of July 2022 to get your 11 digit eligibility code (starts with 5000 or 11) for next term September 2022 You should have given us your Wligibility code for verification to the local authority and sign a Parental Declaration and agreement not later than 5th of August 2022. For others who are already on the scheme, you will need to reconfirm your eligibility every 3 months and give us the eligibility code again for verification. You can also contact HMRC on 0300 123 4097 if you have any problems with getting a code.

You can use the Childcare choice website to also apply for Tax - free Childcare.
